Article 1 THE REPUBLICAN PARTY

Section 1.1 Membership

The Republican Party of Goshen County, State of Wyoming, shall be composed of all persons registered as Republicans to vote in Goshen County.

Section 1.2 Governance

Section 1.2.1 Powers Authorized

The Goshen County Convention of the Republican Party, when assembled, shall be the governing body of the Party and at all other times such governance shall be vested in the County Central Committee of the Republican Party.

Section 1.2.2 Role

The role of the Goshen County Republican Party is: to recruit citizens to join the Republican Party; to establish the Platform of the Goshen County Republican Party; to achieve the election of Republican candidates who substantially uphold the platform of the Goshen County Republican Party and to conduct the business of the Goshen County Republican Party.

Article 2 PROCEDURE AND DEFINITION

Section 2.1 Parliamentary Authority

The rules contained in the current edition of Robert's Rules of Order Newly Revised shall govern the Goshen County Republican Party in all cases to which they are applicable and in which they are not inconsistent with these bylaws and any special rules of order the Goshen County Republican Party may adopt.

Section 2.2 Dispute Resolution Process

The Goshen County Republican Party adopts and, by reference herein, incorporates the entirety of the Wyoming Republican Party dispute resolution process (now currently referenced as Article II, Section 2 of the Wyoming Republican Party Bylaws), as amended, which shall govern all disputes within the county party.

Section 2.3 Tellers Required

As provided by Robert's Rules of Order at least two (2) tellers shall be appointed by the County Chairman for all forms of voting herein requiring a count of individual votes.

Section 2.4 Use of Pronouns

Unless otherwise herein provided, the use of the masculine shall be deemed to include the feminine gender.

Section 2.5 Proxy Definition

The term proxy as used in these Bylaws shall require a written document, bearing the signature of the qualified voter, specifying the identity of the authorized substitute voter and the specific meeting at which the substitution is authorized. A proxy shall be delivered in original form or by facsimile to the presiding officer prior to the authorized substitute casting any vote. A proxy shall be deemed valid if delivered to an officer or the Secretary by email, and the sender can be clearly identified as a qualified voting member of the body.

Section 2.6 Platform Definition

A Platform is the declared policy of a political party and consists of timeless and enduring constitutional conservative principles.

Section 2.7 Resolution Definition

A Resolution is defined as a timely, formal expression of opinion, intent, call to action, or an expression of firmness of purpose.

Section 2.8 Declared Emergencies

In the event of a declared Federal or State Emergency, all meetings and conventions may be conducted via electronic means in which all participants can simultaneously hear each other and have the opportunity for recognition similar to a regular in-person meeting. Any requirements for ballot votes may be waived, votes may be conducted via email vote or other electronic means as determined by the meeting. Other allowances for electronic meetings may be allowed elsewhere in these rules. Any conflicting language in the rules shall defer to this rule.

Section 2.9 Goshen County General Rules for Candidates

Section 2.9.1 Candidate Platform Review

The Goshen County Republican Party shall make an electronic copy of the most recent Platform available on its website. The County Chairman shall distribute a copy of the Platform to each local republican candidate along with all other candidate application papers. The County Chairman shall request each non-judicial candidate to indicate whether the candidate agrees, disagrees, or is undecided for each bullet point item of the Party Principles included in the Preamble of the Platform and may include comments if desired. The County Chairman shall

also request that each non-judicial candidate read the entire Platform and indicate at least ten (10) line items from the Platform that the candidate strongly supports. All candidates for non-judicial offices should file the completed Platform Review containing the candidate's responses at the time of filing for office. Candidates' responses shall be collected and recorded by the county party and may be published on the county party's website prior to the primary.

At the discretion of the Executive Committee of the county party, a candidate's response may be excluded from posting to the website of the county party.

Section 2.9.2 Candidate Funding

A candidate must return the candidate's completed Platform Review and the completed Party funding application to be eligible to receive funds from the county party.

Article 3 GOSHEN COUNTY CENTRAL COMMITTEE

Section 3.1 Membership

The Republican Central Committee of Goshen County, State of Wyoming, shall consist of the properly elected or appointed Republican Precinct Committeemen and Committeewomen in a County who shall hold office for a term of two (2) years or until their successors have been properly elected or appointed. Each precinct shall elect one (1) Committeeman and one (1) Committeewoman for each two hundred fifty (250) votes or major fraction thereof cast for the Republican candidate for U.S. Representative in the last general election but provided no precinct shall be entitled to less than one (1) Precinct Committeeman and one (1) Precinct Committeewoman.

Section 3.2 Precinct Committeemen and Committeewomen

All Precinct Committeeman and Committeewoman representatives shall be electors registered in the republican party and resident in the precinct.

Section 3.3 Precinct Boundary Changes

If a precinct Boundary line is changed for any reason, the County Commissioners shall determine the number of Precinct Committeemen and Committeewomen to which the affected precinct is entitled.

Section 3.4 Residency Required

All County Central Committee members in office on the date the Notice of the County Central Committee meeting is published, shall be allowed to vote at said meeting.

Section 3.5 Term

The term of office for all precinct committeemen and committeewomen shall be two (2) years and shall begin on the first Monday in January of the year following their election.

Section 3.6 Officer Voting Conditions

All elected officers in the positions of Chairman, Vice Chairman, State Committeeman, State Committeewoman, Secretary, and Treasurer shall be permitted to vote as full members of the County Central Committee if they are precinct committee representatives. No person may vote more than once with the exception of proxy votes regardless of how many positions they hold. The chair may vote on all matters decided by a secret ballot vote or in cases where his vote will alter the outcome.

Section 3.7 Meetings

The County Central Committee shall meet:

Section 3.7.1 Following a Primary Election

During the month of January of each odd numbered year after the County Chairman has received notice from the County Clerk that all of the County Central Committee members have been certified elected, for the purpose of organization. The meeting shall be held at the time and place determined by the County Chairman.

Section 3.7.2 Odd Numbered Years

During the month of March of each odd numbered year at the County seat for the purpose of electing the County Chairman and vice-chairman, one (1) State Committeeman and one (1) State Committeewoman, and other offices as provided by the County Party Bylaws. The election of officers shall be by secret ballot and the number of votes cast for each candidate announced. The Chairman shall publish a notice of the March meeting of the Central Committee not less than ten (ten) days before this meeting.

Section 3.7.3 Use of Electronic Meeting Platforms

The County Executive Committee may decide that any meeting of the County Central Committee may be held by video or telephone conference in the event of a declared county or state emergency. County Central Committee meetings may permit member attendance by video or telephone conference for reasons of distance, disability, or weather.

Section 3.7.4 Other Times

At other times and places as may be determined by the County Chairman or the County Executive Committee.

Section 3.7.5 Meeting Request by Central Committee

Meetings of the County Central Committee may be called by the County Chairman or upon written request of twenty five percent (25%) of the County Central Committee members.

Section 3.7.6 Notice of Meeting

The County Chairman shall publish a Notice of all meetings of the County Central Committee in the official county newspaper, being of general county circulation, not less than two (2) days prior to a meeting. Notice of all meetings shall be mailed (postal service or electronic) to each member of the County Central Committee not less than five (5) days prior to a meeting. The County Chairman shall also deposit Notice of the March meeting of each odd numbered year in the office of the County Clerk not less than ten (10) days before this meeting.

Section 3.7.7 Requirement of Notice

Notwithstanding the above provision, The County Chairman shall publish a notice of all other meetings of the County Central Committee in accordance with state statute.

Section 3.7.8 Open Meetings

All meetings and conventions of the Goshen County Republican Party that fall under the purview of these bylaws and are properly called shall be open to registered republicans. All guests being allowed to attend do so at the pleasure of the County Chairman whose decision shall be rendered on a case-by-case basis.

In the case the chairman's rendered decision is challenged, any member of the county central committee or county convention may move to place the matter to a vote of the county central committee or county convention which may, by a two-thirds (2/3) vote, overrule the chairman's decision allowing the guest to observe or not.

Article 4 POWERS

The Goshen County Central Committee shall exercise those powers conferred upon it by law and state and County bylaws. The Goshen County Central Committee is empowered to determine policy, make rules, settle disputes, and perform all functions necessary to further and protect the interests of the Goshen County Republican Party as determined by the delegates seated at the Goshen County Convention, or as determined by the party platform, or by the members of the Goshen County Central Committee whenever the Convention is not in session.

Section 4.1 Conduct of Central Committee Meetings

Section 4.1.1 Presiding Officer

The County Chairman shall preside over all meetings of the County Central Committee. If two consecutive tie votes on a question occur the Chairman shall vote to break the tie. If, however, the County Chairman has been duly elected as a member of the County Central Committee, he shall also have a vote on all questions to come before the meeting.

Section 4.1.2 Quorum

Those members of the County Central Committee attending, either in person or by proxy, a properly called meeting of the County Central Committee shall constitute a quorum and be entitled to vote on the issues before the meeting.

Section 4.1.3 Proxy Votes

Proxy votes shall be allowed at a meeting of the County Central Committee. A person holding a proxy for an absent Precinct Committeeman or Precinct Committeewoman must be a resident of the same precinct as the member he represents. No person shall be allowed to vote more than two (2) proxies. A signed proxy shall be deemed valid if delivered to the Chairman or the Secretary electronically and/or in person and the sender can be clearly identified as a qualified voting member of the body.

Section 4.1.4 Voting

Only properly elected, selected, or appointed and ratified Precinct Committeemen and Precinct Committeewomen shall be entitled to vote at Central Committee meetings. All County Central Committee members in office on the date the notice of a County Central Committee meeting is published shall be allowed to vote at the meeting.

Article 5 GOSHEN COUNTY CENTRAL COMMITTEE OFFICERS

Section 5.1 Officers

The Officers of the Goshen County Central Committee shall consist of the County Chairman, Vice-Chairman, Secretary and Treasurer. If two consecutive tie votes on a question occur, the County Chairman shall vote to break the tie.

Section 5.2 Term of Office

The County Chairman and Vice-Chairman shall be elected by the County Central Committee at its March meeting in the odd numbered years to serve for a term of two (2) years. The County Secretary and the County Treasurer shall be appointed by the County Chairman and shall serve for a like term.

Section 5.3 Eligibility

None of the foregoing officers need be members of the County Central Committee, but each must be a resident of the County and be an elector registered in the Republican Party.

Section 5.4 Other Officers

The County Central Committee may provide for the selection of such other officers as it deems advisable.

Section 5.5 Duties of Officers

Section 5.5.1 County Chairman

In addition to the duties with which he is by statute and otherwise herein charged, the County Chairman shall be the chief executive officer of the Republican Party in Goshen County. He shall preside over all meetings of the County Executive Committee, County Convention, and the County Central Committee. When presiding over the County Executive Committee, County Convention, and County Central Committee, and two consecutive tie votes on a question occur the County Chairman shall vote to break the tie whether or not he is a delegate to the County Convention or a member of the County Central Committee. He shall effectuate the several policies determined by said committees. In the event of an emergency, he shall determine a course of action, which shall be referred to the Executive Committee for ratification as soon thereafter as conveniently may be. He shall have the general powers of administration customarily vested in the office of Chairman, not inconsistent with the provisions of these Bylaws.

Section 5.5.2 Vice-Chairman

The Vice-chairman shall assist the County Chairman in the duties as may be assigned to him by the County Chairman. He shall perform the duties and exercise the powers of the County Chairman during the County Chairman's absence or disability.

Section 5.5.3 Secretary

The Secretary shall keep the minutes of all meetings of the County Central Committee and County Convention, and the County Executive Committee. He shall serve on the Credentials Committee.

Section 5.5.4 Treasurer

The Treasurer shall receive all monies of the Goshen County Republican Party and shall disburse same as authorized by the County Chairman. Either the County Chairman or Treasurer may disburse monies as duly authorized.

Section 5.6 County Committees

Section 5.6.1 Sub-Committee Authorization

The Goshen County Central Committee may select sub-committees as it from time to time may determine as proper, and it may delegate any of its powers to such subcommittees.

Section 5.6.2 Executive Committee

The County Executive Committee shall consist of the elected and appointed officers of the County Central Committee and other persons as provided by the bylaws. Such appointment(s) shall be put before the next meeting of the County Central Committee for ratification.

Article 6 GOSHEN COUNTY STATE COMMITTEEMAN AND COMMITTEEWOMAN

Section 6.1 Number

Goshen County shall have a duly elected Republican State Committeeman and a State Committeewoman.

Section 6.2 Term of Office

The County Central Committee shall, at its March meeting in the odd numbered years, elect a State Committeeman and a State Committeewoman for a term of two (2) years.

Section 6.3 Eligibility

Neither the State Committeeman nor the State Committeewoman need be elected members of the County Central Committee, but each must be a resident of the County and be an elector registered in the Republican Party.

Section 6.4 Duties of the State Committeeman and Committeewoman

Section 6.4.1 Duties to Statute and Bylaws

In addition to the duties with which they are by statute and state party bylaws charged, the State Committeeman and State Committeewoman shall support the rules and regulations of the State Central Committee.

Section 6.4.2 Support of Central Committee Actions

The State Committeeman and State Committeewoman are hereby charged to support resolutions approved by the Goshen County Central Committee.

Article 7 GOSHEN COUNTY EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

Section 7.1 Members

The Goshen County Central Committee shall have an Executive Committee. The County Executive Committee shall consist of the elected and appointed officers of the Central Committee. Only Executive Committee members who have been elected by the County Central Committee shall have voting privileges. The County Executive Committee may also include up to eight (8) At-Large Members appointed by the County Executive Committee. At-Large Members shall be non-voting members. County Executive Committee Members may be invited to attend meetings by telephone or by a video conferencing platform. County Executive Committee Members cannot, however, participate by email, text message or social media stream.

Section 7.2 Meetings

The County Chairman shall call meetings of the County Executive Committee. He shall preside over said meetings and shall vote in case of a tie.

Section 7.3 Powers

The County Executive Committee shall have the following powers:

Section 7.3.1 Call Meetings

To call meetings of the County Central Committee as provided in Section 7.2, herein.

Section 7.3.2 Fill Vacancies

To fill vacancies in the offices of Precinct Committeemen and Committeewomen as provided in Section 8.1, herein.

Section 7.3.3 Ratify Actions

To ratify actions taken by the County Chairman in conjunction with the provisions of Section 7.3.3 herein.

Section 7.3.4 Apportion Delegates

To determine the County Convention Delegate Apportionment as provided in Section 10.2, herein.

Section 7.3.5 Further Party Interests

To further the interests of the Republican Party in Goshen County in any manner authorized by law and consistent with the provisions of these Bylaws.

Section 7.3.6 Confirm Vacancy Appointments

To confirm vacancy appointments made by the County Chairman.

Section 7.3.7 Overrule County Chair Actions

The County Executive Committee can overrule the County Chairman by a majority vote with a quorum present.

Article 8 VACANCIES

Vacancies in any of the offices or positions herein provided shall occur by death, resignation, expiration of term, inability to act, or removal from the political subdivision represented.

Vacancies in the various offices shall be filled until the next regular election as follows:

Section 8.1 County Central Committee

A vacancy in the office of a County Central Committee member shall be filled by the County Executive Committee which shall appoint a registered Republican elector residing in the precinct in which the vacancy exists.

Section 8.2 County Chairman

A vacancy in the office of County Chairman shall be filled by the Vice-Chairman.

Section 8.3 Vice Chairman

A vacancy in the office of Vice-Chairman shall be filled by the County Central Committee by election within 120 days of such vacancy.

Section 8.4 Secretary or Treasurer

A vacancy in the office of Secretary or Treasurer shall be filled by appointment by the County Chairman within 120 days of such vacancy.

Section 8.5 State Committeeman or Committeewoman

A vacancy in the office of State Committeeman or Committeewoman occurring by death, resignation, or removal of residence from the County shall be filled by election by the County Central Committee within thirty (30) days of such vacancy.

Article 9 GOSHEN COUNTY PRECINCT CAUCUSES

Section 9.1 Eligibility

All registered Republicans who have resided within the precinct at least ten (10) days and who were registered Republicans prior to the date of the call of the Precinct Caucus shall be entitled to participate and vote at the Precinct Caucus. Proof of such residence and registration shall be either by the most recent available County Clerks' voter list or by the signing of a sworn statement.

Section 9.2 Meetings

In each even number year, the Goshen County Republican Party shall hold Precinct Caucuses not less than ten (10) days prior to the County Convention or at such times as prescribed by the Wyoming State Central Committee or the Republican National Committee. Each Precinct Caucus shall be held on a date, time and specified place within the County as directed by the County Chairman.

Section 9.3 Notice of Meetings

The County Chairman shall publish a Notice of the date, time, and specified place within the County of each Precinct Caucus by any means, physical or electronic, reasonably calculated to give actual notice to the electors in the county not less than ten (10) days prior to such Precinct Caucuses. The calls for Precinct Caucuses may be combined in a single notice.

Section 9.4 Conduct of Precinct Caucuses

Section 9.4.1 Presiding Officer

Either a Precinct Committeeman or Precinct Committeewoman in attendance at the Precinct Caucus shall be elected Caucus Chairman.

Section 9.4.2 No Committeeman or Committeewoman Present

In the event there is neither a Precinct Committeeman nor a Precinct Committeewoman in attendance at the Precinct Caucus; then those assembled and qualified to vote shall elect, from among their number, a person who shall serve as Caucus Chairman.

Section 9.4.3 Quorum

Those eligible precinct residents attending a regularly called Precinct Caucus shall constitute a quorum.

Section 9.4.4 Proxy Votes

Vote by Proxy at Precinct Caucuses shall neither be allowed nor recognized.

Section 9.4.5 Procedure

The Caucus Chairman shall conduct the Precinct Caucus. He shall take nominations from the floor of registered Republicans residing within the precinct for the number of delegates and alternates to which such precinct is entitled. The election of Delegates and Alternates shall be by secret ballot, if desired, by anyone in attendance at the Precinct Caucus. He shall call for any Resolutions, Platform planks, or County or State Bylaw changes to come before the caucus.

Section 9.4.6 Certification of Delegates and Alternates to County Convention

The Caucus Chairman shall, within the next five (5) succeeding days, certify in writing and deliver to the County Chairman the names of those elected as Delegates and Alternates to the County Convention from the precinct, and all Resolution, Platform planks and County or State bylaw changes proposed by the Precinct Caucus.

Section 9.4.7 Exceptions

If for any reason:

- i) a Precinct Caucus is not held, and Precinct Delegates and Alternates are not duly elected as prescribed above; or,
- ii) the Caucus Chairman fails to certify the names of those Precinct Delegates and Alternates elected; or,
- iii) the Caucus Chairman fails to deliver the certified names of those elected to the County Chairman, then,

Section 9.4.8 Allocation of delegates and alternatives

The County Chairman, with approval of the majority of the County Executive Committee, is authorized to appoint the prescribed number of Delegates from the precinct(s) to the County Convention.

Article 10 GOSHEN COUNTY CONVENTION

Section 10.1 Membership

Delegates to the county Convention shall be the members of the County Central Committee and those chosen by caucuses of the Precincts within Goshen County. The names of such Delegates shall be certified in writing by the Caucus Chairman of each Precinct Caucus to the County Chairman within the next five (5) days succeeding the Precinct Caucus. All County Convention Delegates and Alternates shall, at the time of the Convention, be residents of the Precinct they represent. If the prescribed number of Delegates is not duly elected by Precinct Caucuses for any specific Precinct, the County Chairman with majority approval of the County

Executive Committee is authorized to appoint the prescribed number of delegates from the Precinct(s) to the County Convention.

Section 10.2 Apportionment of Precinct Delegates and Alternates

The County Executive Committee shall designate the overall number of delegates and an equal number of alternates to be elected to the County Convention. The delegates to which each precinct shall be entitled at the county convention shall be determined, as nearly as possible, in proportion to the total votes cast in each Precinct for all Republican candidates for the office of House of Representatives of the United States in the last preceding general election; provided, however, that no Precinct shall be represented by less than two (2) delegates.

Section 10.3 Meeting

The County Convention of the Goshen County Republican Party shall be held during the month of March of each even numbered year.

Section 10.4 Notice of Meeting

Notice of the County Convention shall be mailed to all delegates not less than five (5) days prior to the Convention and shall be published in the official county newspaper, being of general county circulation, not less than two (2) days prior to the Convention.

Section 10.5 Powers

The County Convention for Goshen County shall have the power:

Section 10.5.1 To Amend Bylaws

To amend the Bylaws, Rules and Regulations of the county party as provided for an Section 11.2,

Section 10.5.2 Elect Delegates to State Convention

To elect the delegates and alternates to the State Convention and determine the priority in which alternates shall serve,

Section 10.5.3 Elect Delegates to National Convention

To elect the Delegate or Alternate to the Republican National Convention,

Section 10.5.4 Other Business

To conduct such other party business as may come before the County Convention.

Section 10.6 Conduct of County Convention

Section 10.6.1 Presiding Officer

The County Chairman duly elected by the County Central Committee, his successor, or his designee, shall serve as Chairman of the County Convention. If two consecutive tie votes on a question occur, the County Chairman shall vote to break the tie. If, however, the County Chairman has been duly elected as a delegate at the Precinct Caucus in his Precinct, he shall also have a vote on all matters at the Convention.

Section 10.6.2 Quorum

Those delegates attending a duly called County Convention shall constitute a quorum.

Section 10.6.3 Proxy Votes

Vote by Proxy at County Convention shall neither be allowed nor recognized.

Section 10.6.4 Procedure

The unit rule method of voting shall not be adopted by any Precinct delegation. All County Conventions shall be governed by Robert's Rules of Order as provided in Section 2.1, herein.

Section 10.6.5 Committees

The following Committees shall act at the County Convention: Credentials; Bylaws; Platform; Resolutions; and Nominating. The powers and duties of such Committees shall be those customarily performed thereby and as herein provided.

Section 10.6.5.1 Credentials

The Credentials Committee shall consist of the County Secretary and such other members as the County Chairman shall appoint. The Committee shall be responsible for examining credentials of all delegates to the County Convention.

Section 10.6.5.2 Bylaws

The Bylaws Committee shall consist of such members as the County Chairman shall appoint. The committee shall receive written By-Law revision to be coordinated and presented to the County Convention. Nothing herein, however, shall preclude any delegate from submitting additional By-Law revisions from the floor, in writing, at the County Convention.

Section 10.6.5.3 Platform

The Platform Committee shall consist of members appointed by the County Chairman from delegates to the County Convention. The committee shall meet at least one (1) week prior to the County Convention to draft Platform Proposals and to receive Platform suggestions from the Precinct Caucuses to be coordinated and presented to the County Convention. However,

nothing shall preclude any delegate from submitting additional Platform Proposals from the floor, in writing, at the County Convention.

Section 10.6.5.4 Resolutions

The Resolutions Committee shall consist of members appointed by the County Chairman from delegates to the County Convention. The committee shall meet at least one (1) week prior to the County Convention to draft Resolutions and to receive written Resolutions from the Precinct Caucuses to be coordinated and presented to the County Convention. However, nothing shall preclude any delegate from submitting additional Resolutions from the floor, in writing, at the County Convention.

Section 10.6.5.5 Nominating

The Nominating Committee shall consist of such members as the County Chairman shall appoint. The Committee shall receive all nominations to be coordinated and presented to the County Convention. Nothing herein, however, shall preclude any delegate from submitting additional qualified nominations from the floor at the County Convention.

Section 10.6.5.6 Other Committees

The County Chairman may appoint other committees as he deems necessary.

Section 10.7 Order of Business:

The Order of Business in the Goshen County Republican Convention shall be as follows:

- i) Call to order by the County Chairman
- ii) Report of the Credentials Committee
- iii) Report of the Bylaws Committee
- iv) Report of the Platform Committee
- v) Report of the Resolutions Committee
- vi) Report of the Nominations Committee
- vii) Nominations from the floor
- viii) Elections: Selection of delegates and alternates to the Wyoming Republican State Convention
- ix) Elections: Selection of the delegate and/or alternate to the Republican National Convention – when entitled
- x) Other Business
- xi) Adjournment

Such Order of Business may be changed by a majority vote of the County Convention.

Section 10.8 Roll Call Votes

A Roll Call Vote (“Yeas” and “Nays”) upon any question presented to the Convention may be ordered by the Chairman of such Convention or can be compelled by a majority vote of the delegates elected to such convention. However, a request for a Roll Call Vote must be sought before the question is first voted upon. The preceding sentence in no way interferes with the right of a delegate to request a Standing Vote on a question presented to the Convention.

Article 11 RATIFICATION AND AMENDMENTS

Section 11.1 Effectuation

These Bylaws, upon adoption by a majority vote of the Delegates seated to the Goshen County Convention, shall repeal and replace all Bylaws that preceded them and shall be binding upon adjournment of the convention at which they are adopted.

Section 11.2 Amendments

Section 11.2.1 Authority to Change

These Bylaws may be repealed or amended only by a majority vote of the Delegates seated to the Goshen County Republican Party Convention.

Section 11.2.2 Effective Date

Amendments to these Bylaws shall become effective upon adjournment of the convention at which the amendments were approved.

Section 11.2.3 Certification Required

All amendments shall be certified by the County Chairman and County Secretary and shall be filed with the State Party Secretary within thirty (30) days after adjournment of the County Convention.

Article 12 COUNTY SHARES

County shares are a mandatory payment to the State Party biennially to defer the costs of operations including data production, informational support, networking, and other work produced by the State Party in support of County Party function and activity. County parties that intentionally fail to pay, as determined by the State Executive Committee, at least half of their County Shares, by mid-term will negate a county party from receiving the products, services, and support produced by the State Party for the duration of the following biennium or until all past shares are paid in full. Delegates to the State Convention will be reduced in proportion to the percentage of shares unpaid.

County shares are calculated as a baseline of \$1,000 per county plus a prorated amount of the Biennial Operational Budget based upon the percentage of Republican votes in each county in the U.S. Congressional Representative election cycle.


Article 13 SEVERABILITY
